# Why do we shake with the left hand?

Lord Robert Baden-Powell suggested a Left Handshake to recognise other members of the Movement, and it is still used widely.

When asked to explain the origin, Lord Baden-Powell related a legend told to him in West Africa:

Two hostile, neighbouring communities decided to try to live together in peace, and so they flung down their shields, which were carried on the <u>left arm</u>, and advanced, unprotected, to greet each other with their <u>left hands</u> extended in trust and friendship.

#### Top section awards

There are three top section awards, for each section, they build on Theme awards.

- ✓ Section **Bronze** award: a girl needs to complete any two Theme awards from her current section.
- ✓ Section Silver award: a girl needs to complete any four Theme awards from her current section.
- ✓ Section Gold award: a girl needs to earn all six Theme awards and then do a final challenge. The challenge changes depending on a girl's section and her interests.

There is no final challenge for the section Bronze or section Silver award.

These awards are a great achievement and a big commitment. So it's up to each girl whether she chooses to complete the top section awards.

There are woven and metal badges for the section top section awards - and the Gold award metal pin badges have a secret message on the back of them.

These badges can only be ordered through your **County badge secretary**. Ask your Division Commissioner or local volunteer depot for more details.

## **World Thinking Day**

Celebrated since 1926, World Thinking Day is a day of international friendship. It is an opportunity to speak out on issues that affect young women and fundraise for 10 million Girl Guides and Girl Scouts in 150 countries. This celebration of ten million girls' worldwide takes place every year on 22nd February.

It remains a day for all Guides and Girl Scouts to think of each other and celebrate their sisters all around the world.


#### **DID YOU KNOW?**
