How much will it cost?



Girlguiding Central Glamorgan's wonderful home by the sea

Are you looking to take your unit/group away? Would you like to stay in a fabulous location just a stones throw from the beach?

Then Gorwelion is definitely for you!

Gorwelion is based just outside Porthcawl in South Wales, just 10 minutes from the M4 and it's the perfect place to spend time enjoying the gorgeous scenery and soaking up the sunshine. The main house sleeps 33, (3 dorms of 8, leader's room of 3 and an upstairs dorm for older members that sleeps 6). There is also a self-contained flat that sleeps 4, families are welcome to hire this too.

There are 2 campsites with toilet and shower facilities. The large site has enough cooking equipment to cater for 50 and the small site has cooking equipment to cater for 30. The 5.5 acre site boasts stunning views of the coast and the beach is just a 20 minute walk away.
